SUBJECT: Delays in cargo examinations in the Port of New York/Newark

Customs and Border Protection (CBP) is notifying the trade community of some delays experienced during the week of 07/16/2012 – 07/20/2012 in the delivery of refrigerated container boxes from the marine terminals in the Port of New York/Newark to the designated Centralized Examination Station (CES) locations. CBP experienced examination delays due to the lack of available generator sets (gen-sets) and chassis at the marine terminal locations. Gen-sets are units used to generate electricity which allows refrigerated cargo to maintain a consistent temperature when moving between terminal and CES locations. CBP has been working diligently with the trade community to reduce these short term delays in the examination process and improve overall service and efficiency.
